Dear Campus Research Community,

On Monday, June 8, 2020, the research enterprise will move into <u>Phase 1</u>, <u>Limited Occupancy Phase</u>. Observe these rules for your safety and the safety of the entire community.

- Researchers must work remotely if they are not approved by the deans to be on campus in Phase 1.
- Researchers must not come to campus if feeling unwell.
- Researchers must complete the <u>COVID 19 Employee Screening</u>
   <u>Checklist</u> for symptom tracking/monitoring <u>prior to coming to campus</u>

  every day.
- Researchers must complete the <u>Employee Building Visitation Log</u> daily for contact tracing purposes.
- Researchers must not come to campus if living with or caring for someone with COVID 19 or if awaiting a COVID 19 test result.
- Researchers must wear face coverings/masks in university buildings. Please bring your own face coverings.
- Researchers must practice good hygiene (frequent handwashing) and must clean and disinfect all high contact surfaces.
- Researchers must abide by the following social distancing restrictions in research spaces: no more than 25% occupancy and not to exceed 1 person/ 200ft<sub>2</sub>.
