#### Guest Speaker: Susan Winter, Associate Dean for Research – iSchool

Dr. Winter, drawing on her years of experience working at the National Science Foundation (NSF), will be hosting 2 information sessions this fall exploring key topics in funding success. Each session is a stand-alone seminar, which focuses on an important aspect of the funding cycle and proposal development process. These are designed to be participatory, therefore the maximum capacity will be capped at 30 people per session.

#### Session 1:

##### Topic – What are They Really Asking For? Diagramming an NSF Solicitation

Gain experience in understanding exactly what is being asked for in proposal solicitations. Using an NSF example, the group will learn how to a) diagram a solicitation – separating language that is standard for all solicitations from the meat of the request; b) interpret solicitation terminology; and c) better judge potential project fit. This session will be beneficial for anyone who wants to read solicitations, Dear Colleague letters, and program descriptions with fresh eyes and laser in on the most important aspects quickly and thoroughly. Participants are encouraged to bring a sample solicitation they would like to explore.
